### Required Preliminary Coursework for the RN with an Associate Degree or Diploma:

All RNs with an associate degree or diploma are required to meet university and School of Nursing requirements for undergraduate non-nursing coursework (courses above) and to take two bridge courses NURS6910 (Caring for Families and Communities - 5 credit hours) and NURS6930 (Leadership and Management in Nursing - 3 credit hours). Additionally, students who have not completed an undergraduate health assessment course will be required to complete an on-line health assessment course.

**NOTE:** Students admitted to the R.N.-M.S. Program and requiring the bridge courses, NURS6910 and NURS6930, must work closely with the course administrators. NURS6910 requires clinical site arrangement ONE semester before registering for the course. If clinical site arrangement is not done the semester before, students will not be eligible to take NURS6910 in accordance with their program plans."
